Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

Request

Please find below our response to your correspondence dated 9 January, in which you made the following request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002:

Please provide all information held by the Scottish Police Authority (eg, correspondence with Police Scotland, Scottish Government legal directorate, or the Crown Office) related to the disposal/potential disposal of productions used in the prosecution of Luke Mitchell (HMA v Luke Mitchell, 2005). This request relates to the time period from January 1, 2021, to the date of responding to this request. The information I would like includes (but is not be restricted to) information related to an initial decision to dispose of productions in the case, and a subsequent decision to halt the disposal of productions.

Your request for information has been considered and the Scottish Police Authority (SPA) is able to provide the following.

Right to Review

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.

Should you wish to appeal against the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
