Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

Request

Please find below our response to your correspondence dated 15 January, in which you made the following request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

Thank you for providing information on your entity's spending at this [page](#).

However, I'm unable to find any details on the transactions made by your entity prior to April 2020 or since March 2023.

Therefore, I'd like to make a request under the Freedom of Information Act for all of your entity's payments above £25,000 for January 2016 to March 2020 and April 2023 to December 2023.

Please provide the data in a machine readable format (preferably csv). As a minimum, please make sure to include the date, value and recipient of each transaction. Please also provide details on the procurement category of each transaction if you have it.

Response

Your request for information has been considered and the Scottish Police Authority is able to provide the following.

Statements of payments above £25,000 to companies providing services to the Authority and/or Police Scotland for the requested timeframes,

January 2016 to March 2020 and April 2023 to December 2023, are not held by the Authority. To explain, work of this nature is provided to the Authority by Police Scotland's finance function.

Right to Review

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome, you can ask us to review our response. If you want us to carry out a review, please let us know within 40 working days. If you remain dissatisfied after review, you can appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months. You can apply [online](#), by email to enquiries@itspublicknowledge.info or by letter to Scottish Information Commissioner, Kinburn Castle, Doubledykes Road, St Andrews, Fife, KY16 9DS.

Should you wish to appeal against the Commissioner's decision, you can appeal to the Court of Session, only if you think the law has not been applied correctly.
