Request

How many arrests has your force made of individuals in possession of Nitrous oxide with intent to supply for recreational use since the 8th of November?

How many charges has your force made of individuals in possession of Nitrous oxide with intent to supply for recreational use since the 8th of November?

How many prosecutions has your force pursued of individuals in possession of Nitrous oxide with intent to supply for recreational use since the 8th of November?

Should you wish to appeal against the Commissioner's decision, you can appeal to the Court of Session, only if you think the law has not been applied correctly.
