REQUEST DETAILS

Please find below our response to your correspondence dated 30 September in which you made the following request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002:

I am a private landlord for the property at [personal information]. I have been advised by the factor for the property that another tenant within the block of flats has advised them that the police have been called out 4 times within the last month for antisocial behaviour (noise related).

I would like to find out the following information:

- if the police have in fact been called out to my property
- when did the call outs occur and at what time.
- what was the reason for the call outs
- what was the result of the call outs (was there excessive noise that had to be turned down or were noise levels acceptable when the police attended the property?)
- has any further action been taken that as a private landlord I need to be aware of?

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.
