# Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

### Request

Please find below our response to your correspondence dated 7 October 2024, in which you made the following request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

"Could you please confirm the name of your current Duty Management System (DMS)?

- 1. When was this system installed?
- 2. When does the contract for your DMS come to an end?
- 3. Actual spend on this contract, from the start of the contract to the current date: (total cost incurred on this contract from its start date to the current date, including details of the contract's duration (years covered) and the cost for any renewals)?

Can you also provide details of the Human Resource Management System (HRMS) you are currently using?"

#### Response

The Scottish Police Authority has considered your request and is able to provide the following.

The Scottish Police Authority does not hold the information requested.<sup>1</sup>

Although the Scottish Police Authority is the named Contracting Authority for all SPA and Police Scotland procurement, the procurement function to put in place such contracts is performed by Police Scotland.

Also of interest may be the <u>regulated contract register</u> which is publicly available on Public Contract Scotland. This provides details of live regulated contracts over the value of £50,000.

## **Right to Review**

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of your request you can ask for a review within 40 working days. You must specify the reason for your dissatisfaction and submit your request by email to <a href="mailto:foi@spa.police.uk">foi@spa.police.uk</a> or by letter to Scottish Police Authority, 1 Pacific Quay, Glasgow, G51 1DZ.

If you remain dissatisfied after review, you can appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months. You can apply online, by email to enquiries@foi.scot or by letter to Scottish Information Commissioner, Kinburn Castle, Doubledykes Road, St Andrews, Fife, KY16 9DS.

Should you wish to appeal against the Commissioner's decision, you can appeal to the Court of Session, only if you think the law has not been applied correctly.
