Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

Request

Please find below our response to your correspondence dated 8 July 2024, in which you made the following request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

Under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act, could you please provide a full copy of the Estates Continuous Improvement report, sometimes referred to as the Estates Masterplan.

I'm particularly interested, if the full report is unavailable, in a copy of Stage 1 of the masterplan - which sets out a list of 343 buildings belonging to the organisation, and their status of recommendation (ie dispose, retain etc).

The report I refer to was detailed here in a meeting of the SPA's Resources Committee on June 19, 2024. Page 5 lists the regional area of each building, but not the identity of each building, which is what I'm requesting through this submission.

Should you wish to appeal against the Commissioner's decision, you can appeal to the Court of Session, only if you think the law has not been applied correctly.
