## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

### REQUEST DETAILS

Please find below our response to your correspondence dated 5 May, but which was received by the Scottish Police Authority on 27 June, in which you made the following request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002:

*I am looking for information regarding parking my car in the street, I know it is illegal to park a car a car facing the wrong way over night I have a disabled bay, is it legal to park the car in the bay facing oncoming traffic over night.*

### RESPONSE

Your request for information has been considered and the Scottish Police Authority (SPA) is able to provide the following;

### RIGHT TO REVIEW

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which your request has been dealt with you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by

email to [foi@spa.pnn.police.uk](mailto:foi@spa.pnn.police.uk) or by post to Corporate Management Team, Scottish Police Authority, 1 Pacific Quay, Glasgow, G51 1DZ.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.

Should you wish to appeal against the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
