Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

Request

Please find below our response to your correspondence dated 16 December 2024, in which you made the following request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002:

- “1. What were the total number of dog theft crimes in 2023 (monthly breakdown if possible)?
2. What was the outcome (charge/summons, community resolution, active investigation, evidential difficulties, no suspect identified) for each dog theft crime in 2023?
3. How many dogs were listed with each dog theft crime in 2023?
4. If this question doesn't take us beyond the time required for free FOI feedback, can details about stolen dog breed, gender, age, and location of theft (walk, home, garden, outside shop, from car etc) also be provided for 2023 please?
5. If this question doesn't take us beyond the time required for free FOI feedback, can postcode of recorded crime and CRN be included?”.

Response

The Scottish Police Authority has considered your request and can confirm that the Authority does not hold the information requested.¹

The Authority provides governance and oversight of policing in Scotland and does not hold information on operational policing matters.

Right to Review

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of your request you can ask for a review within 40 working days. You must specify the reason for your dissatisfaction and submit your request by email to foi@spa.police.uk or by letter to Scottish Police Authority, 1 Pacific Quay, Glasgow, G51 1DZ.

If you remain dissatisfied after review, you can appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months. You can apply [online](#), by email to enquiries@foi.scot or by letter to Scottish Information Commissioner, Kinburn Castle, Doubledykes Road, St Andrews, Fife, KY16 9DS.

Should you wish to appeal against the Commissioner's decision, you can appeal to the Court of Session, only if you think the law has not been applied correctly.
